

English Language Arts 12

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

English Language Arts 12 is designed to familiarize the student with English authors/literature and to correlate this exposure with the history of England. Students will investigate the growth and development of the English language through the examination of major British authors, their cultures, contributions, and influences upon the world of writers. For the student, there is a primary emphasis on evaluation, interpretation, and application to their lives. This is achieved by responding to the literature through the writing process, listening and viewing skills, oral communication, and technology. Through discussion, research and writing, the student will learn to analyze literature and see each author's work in its appropriate historical context. Students will review mechanical and grammatical forms of the English language, using greater accuracy and precision in writing. In addition, students will be instructed in the Modern Language Association (MLA) style for documentation. *This course meets all Common Core Standards for the grade level adopted by the State of Ohio Board of Education*.
